**CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION**  
On **YOUR** specific collection day between the dates of January 8-12 & January 16-18, 2024

**SPRING METAL COLLECTION**  
On **YOUR** specific collection day between the dates of April 1-5 & April 9-11, 2024.

**FALL METAL COLLECTION**  
On **YOUR** specific collection day between the dates of October 8-10 & October 14-18, 2024.

**Bulky items such as upholstered furniture, mattresses, toilet, and large plastic items can be put out and picked up on regular pickup days. Do not put these items out on the Spring and Fall metal collection dates which are for metal items only.**

**Acceptable Items Include:** Scrap Metal, white appliances, barbecues, emptied metal barrels, baseboard heaters, lawn mowers (fluid removed), bicycles, hot water tanks, empty oil tanks and any other type of metal. Fridges and Freezers may only be picked up if a certified refrigeration technician has removed the freon safely and this is indicated with a Provincial tag.

**TIP:**  
Why wait for one of the metal collections when you can drop it off anytime throughout the year for free. Did you know that metal items, refrigerators, freezers, and A/C units can be taken to the Regional Materials Recovery Facility, located at 4571 Hwy 3, West Green Harbour free-of-charge at any time during the year?

Paint cans, oil containers, oil filters, and glycol containers are **not accepted curbside at any time.** These products must be taken to an approved collection site. These items can also be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Depot at 243 Sandy Point Road on the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month. (Tuesday if the Monday is a holiday)

Tipping Fee is \$60.00 per tonne for construction & demolition materials. Tipping fee is \$40.00 per tonne for Commercial brush/leaf & yard waste.

**All materials must be separated into the following streams:**

- 1) Wood items
- 2) Roofing shingles
- 3) Gypsum board/drywall, plaster
- 4) Vinyl/plastic building materials, carpeting, built up roofing, ceiling tiles, vinyl floor/linoleum, wiring, lighting fixtures and insulation.

**Insulation** - Please have fiberglass insulation in bags, so it will not blow around the site. Sheets of Styrofoam™ insulation can be taken whole, but must be bagged if in smaller pieces. **Brush/Leaf and Yard waste must be no larger than 6 inches in diameter for future processing.**

Items that are **FREE** to dispose of include:  
● Scrap Metals ● Metal Appliances  
● Wire Lobster Traps ● Lobster Rope ● Leaf and Yard Waste (Residential only)

**Items NOT accepted during regular curbside waste collection are listed below:**

You can return up to four used car/truck tires (at any one time) to any tire retailer in NS. Tires must be off the rim and free of mud and debris.

All construction waste, as well as any solid wooden items, must be taken to the Regional Materials Recovery Facility in West Green Harbour to be recycled.

Propane tanks, paint cans, and other household hazardous waste items are to be taken to the Hazardous Waste Depot at 243 Sandy Point Road, on the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month for proper disposal from 9am - 1pm & 2pm - 4pm. (ie. adhesive, tar, pesticides, oil, etc.)

Electronics must be taken to the EPRA (Electronic Products Recycling Association) Depot at 108 King Street (across from the Shelburne Mall) to be recycled. As of January 2020, Microwaves, GPS, Video Game Consoles, modems and external hard drives are no longer items eligible for curbside pickup and must be taken to the Enviro-Depot for recycling.

## ORGANICS (GREEN CART)

### ALL FOOD WASTE INCLUDING

- Meat, fish and bones
- Egg shells
- Tea bags and coffee grounds
- All fruits and vegetables
- Cooking oil and fat
- Paper drinking cups (lids in blue bag)

### SOILED AND/OR WET PAPER INCLUDING

- Disposable Coffee Cups (lids removed and placed in blue bag)
- Pizza boxes
- Waxed boxes (pie shells, etc.)
- Paper Towels
- Napkins
- Waxed paper
- Non-metallic gift wrap paper (tape removed)
- Leaves, garden waste, plants, or weeds
- Sawdust, wood chips, or grass clippings

**Absolutely NO plastic bags, metals or glass are permitted in your compost.**

**Biodegradable bags *MUST* bear this logo to be accepted:**



## RECYCLABLES (BLUE BAG)

Beverage Containers (excluding milk) may be taken to your local ENVIRO-DEPOT™ for a 5 cent refund.

### PAPER/FIBRE PRODUCTS

- Newspaper
- Paper Egg Cartons
- Cardboard (To be flattened and tied into bundles no more than 2 ft. x 3 ft.)
- Boxboard (Cereal, frozen food boxes, etc.)
- Tissue Boxes
- Phone books
- Cigarette packages (Foil removed - garbage)
- Catalogues
- Paper, flyers and magazines
- Softcover books
- Hardcover books (Interior pages only; covers to be disposed of in garbage)
- Empty paper towel/toilet paper rolls

### BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

- Glass jars & bottles
- Beer & liquor bottles
- Pop & water bottles
- Juice & milk cartons
- Disposable Coffee Cups (rinsed clean)

### ALL PLASTICS

- Grocery Bags
- Clean plastic food bags
- Shampoo bottles
- Plastic tubs & lids
- Cleaning fluid bottle

### TIN / ALUMINUM

- Steel tin food cans
- Aluminum foil/pie plates (Clean)

**ALL recyclables should be clean and dry to avoid rejection. Please use BLUE BAGS for all your recyclables.**



Paper can be left on tin cans, windows in envelopes, and plastic sleeves on Kleenex boxes.

## GARBAGE (CLEAR BAG)

Any non-compostable or non-recyclable materials

- Pet litter/waste
- Empty coffee pods (coffee in compost)
- Styrofoam™ (meat trays, etc.)
- Toothpaste tubes
- Mattresses/Boxsprings/Upholstered Furniture
- Pet food bags (plastic lined)
- Strawberry/Clementine boxes (stapled)
- Chocolate bar wrappers (mix of plastic and aluminum)
- Frozen juice cans (aluminum attached to cardboard)
- Broken glass/ceramic (Put in box marked "broken glass" and tape it up.)
- Small appliances (can opener, tea kettle, mixers, etc.)
- Disposable Diapers
- Metallic giftwrap
- CDs & DVDs
- Potato chip bags
- Broken toys
- Soiled straws/stir sticks
- Empty aerosol cans
- School binders
- Rusted tins/cans

**Lobster / longline bait boxes and bags can be placed in a clear bag and put out with your regular collection items.**

- Absolutely no organics or recyclables are to be placed in your clear garbage bags.
- Do not use feed bags, dog food bags, or other such bags for garbage.
- Household batteries can be dropped off at the Municipality of Shelburne offices for recycling.
